2 Timothy, Lesson 4 - Loyalty to Christ and to His People, part 1 Introduction - Be honest. Have you ever been tempted to be ashamed of someone you loved around certain friends, perhaps because they were out of style, uneducated or "not cool?" A. Questions 1. Where was Paul when he wrote this letter? 2. What was he expecting to happen to him? (4:6-8) 3. What de he want Timothy to do? (4:9, 21) \* Why would it be important for him to come before winter? If you have a hard time figuring it out, What happened to Paul when his boat tried to travel too close to winter? (Acts chapter 27) \* If Timothy waited until after winter, what might happen to Paul before he got there? B. In the back of Paul's mind, he seemed to be concerned that Timothy might hesitate. Why might Timothy be tempted to hesitate and not go quickly to Paul? C. A large portion of the book is dedicated to exhortations to by be shy or fearful, but for Timothy to be bold in coming to Paul in spite of shame and dangers. HOW DOES PAUL MOTIVATE TIMOTHY? I. By reminding him of the faith he had shown in the past -(Chapter 1) A. Read 1:3,4 1. How often did Paul remember Timothy in his prayers? \* Do you know of someone who prays constantly for you? Would you like us to? 2. According to the first part of verse 4, What did Paul remember about Timothy? \* What good things do tears usually indicate about an individual? (unless crocodile tears!) B. Read 1:5 1. Where had Timothy's sincere faith been before coming to him? \* *Thought question* – How had that been transferred to him? C. Read Verse 6 -1. What did Timothy have through the laying on of Paul's hands? \* We're talking miraculous spiritual gift here given through laying on of apostles' hands (Acts 8:18) 2. What should Timothy do regarding that gift? \* Thought question - Though we don't have miraculous spiritual gifts today, we all have certain gifts and talents that we can use for God. What is one you have? What can you do to stir that gift to serve the Lord? D. Read Verse 7 1. What kind of Spirit does God **no**t give us? \_\_\_\_\_ \* Thought question - Can you see Paul's efforts to build up Timothy's confidence? What are some things that God does through His word and His people to build up your confidence to be bolder? II. By reminding Timothy of His own (Paul's) faith A. Read chapter 1 verse 8 1. Paul doesn't want Timothy to be ashamed of what two things?

By pointing out the disloyalty of some (This is the saddest part of the book!)  * We would like to hope that this great man of God had a lot of support from those he helped during this time on "death row" before he was executed. Sadly such wasn't the case. Instead, many of his own friends, even close friends abandoned him.

However, many who could have stood by his side, obviously didn't!

* Have you ever left someone, only later to find out that they really needed your help and encouragement? Tell about it if you want. How did you feel?
* What can we do to make sure that we don't abandon good people,
especially elderly people when they really need us?

**Conclusion** – The last part of this lesson is depressing. But don't despair! Tomorrow we'll read about the few who did stand by Paul in his last days and ask ourselves how we can be like them!

## **Concluding thoughts**

- A. Did Timothy make it in time to Rome to spend Paul's last days with him, praying and asking for God's strength? Or was he delayed and unable to be with him in his last moments?
  - 1. A theory We know that Timothy was arrested at one time and released (Heb. 13:23). The theory is that Timothy did go to Rome and was arrested by Nero (who wasn't very friendly towards Christians) and later released, perhaps when Nero died.
  - 2. We would like to think, yes! But bottom line is we don't know.
  - 3. We'll have to wait until we get to heaven to know!
- B. If you were Timothy would you have taking your time in getting ready to go to Rome? Or, would you have quickly prepared and made every effort to get to him quickly?
  - 1. How can you know if you would have been loyal to Paul?
  - 2. By how loyal you are to Christ now!
  - 3. What would it take to get you to become lethargic about serving Christ? What might make you ashamed to serve Him with all your heart? Mark one
